# Scripture this week:

# Philippians 2:1-11

So if there is any encouragement in Christ, any comfort from love, any participation in the Spirit, any affection and sympathy, <sup>2</sup> complete my joy by being of the same mind, having the same love, being in full accord and of one mind. <sup>3</sup> Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility count others more significant than yourselves. <sup>4</sup>Let each of you look not only to his own interests, but also to the interests of others. 5 Have this mind among yourselves, which is yours in Christ Jesus, <sup>6</sup> who, though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, <sup>7</sup> but emptied himself, by taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men.8 And being found in human form, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross. <sup>9</sup> Therefore God has highly exalted him and bestowed on him the name that is above every name, <sup>10</sup> so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, <sup>11</sup> and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

- 4. What does Paul mean when he says, "complete my joy"?
- 5. How does Paul define humility? How do we see Jesus pictured in v5-11 as the primary example Paul uses for humility?
- 6. What does it mean that Jesus emptied himself?
- 7. How is Jesus being exalted? What is the name that is above every name? What does this say about Jesus? (cf. Isaiah 45:23)
- 8. How would you summarize Paul's big idea of Philippians 2:1-11?

### How does it apply?

- 1. How does the expression of humility get misinterpreted?
- 2. How does the humility of Jesus empower you to serve the best interest of those that claim to treasure Christ? Those yet to believe? How does that get expressed?
- 3. What gifts or talents do you possess that cause you the greatest frustration when they aren't recognized or valued?
- 4. How is humility foundational in the development and maintenance of unity?
