SCRIPTURE THIS WEEK:

John 12:12-26

¹² The next day the large crowd that had come to the feast heard that Jesus was coming to Jerusalem. 13 So they took branches of palm trees and went out to meet him, crying out, "Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord, even the King of Israel!" 14 And Jesus found a young donkey and sat on it, just as it is written, 15 "Fear not, daughter of Zion; behold, your king is coming, sitting on a donkey's colt!" 16 His disciples did not understand these things at first, but when Jesus was glorified, then they remembered that these things had been written about him and had been done to him. 17 The crowd that had been with him when he called Lazarus out of the tomb and raised him from the dead continued to bear witness. 18 The reason why the crowd went to meet him was that they heard he had done this sign. ¹⁹ So the Pharisees said to one another, "You see that you are gaining nothing. Look, the world has gone after him." 20 Now among those who went up to worship at the feast were some Greeks. ²¹ So these came to Philip, who was from Bethsaida in Galilee, and asked him, "Sir, we wish to see Jesus." ²² Philip went and told Andrew; Andrew and Philip went and told Jesus. 23 And Jesus. answered them, "The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. 24 Truly, truly, I say to you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains alone; but if it dies, it bears much fruit. ²⁵ Whoever loves his life loses it, and whoever hates his life in this world will keep it for eternal life. ²⁶ If anyone serves me, he must follow me; and where I am, there will my servant be also. If anyone serves me, the Father will honor him.

Life Group Discussion Questions

John 12:12-26

For the week of October 9, 2022

Reading the Text:

- 1. In your own words, how would you articulate the big idea of this passage?
- 2. Just a few paragraphs earlier, John tells us that "Jesus therefore no longer walked openly among the Jews..." (John 11:54). What contrast do you see in the flow of John's narrative from there to our current passage?
- 3. John tells us that the disciples "did not understand these things at first..." (12:16). What was Jesus doing in this passage that the disciples did not yet understand?
- 4. Jesus' glorification is a theme throughout this passage (vv. 13, 16, 23). In what ways does John set the expectation for how Jesus would truly be glorified?
- 5. John ends this passage with Jesus' encouragement to follow Him. In what ways are we encouraged to follow Him? In what ways might our following look different?

Living it Out:

- 6. Jesus lays out four great benefits to serving Him in vv. 24-26. What are they? Do these feel like great benefits? Why or why not?
- 7. What does it look like to live a life more motivated by eternal life than earthly pursuits?
- 8. In what ways can the Father's reward of honoring us motivate our daily life?
