John tells us about the events leading up to Jesus' betrayal by Judas to encourage us to unreservedly trust Jesus.

So when he had dipped the morsel, he gave it to Judas, the son of Simon Iscariot. <sup>27</sup> Then after he had taken the morsel, Satan entered into him.
