## **SCRIPTURE THIS WEEK:**

#### John 5:30-47

<sup>30</sup> "I can do nothing on my own. As I hear, I judge, and my judgment is just, because I seek not my own will but the will of him who sent me. 31 If I alone bear witness about myself, my testimony is not true. 32 There is another who bears witness about me, and I know that the testimony that he bears about me is true. 33 You sent to John, and he has borne witness to the truth. 34 Not that the testimony that I receive is from man, but I say these things so that you may be saved. 35 He was a burning and shining lamp, and you were willing to rejoice for a while in his light. <sup>36</sup> But the testimony that I have is greater than that of John. For the works that the Father has given me to accomplish, the very works that I am doing, bear witness about me that the Father has sent me. 37 And the Father who sent me has himself borne witness about me. His voice you have never heard, his form you have never seen, 38 and you do not have his word abiding in you, for you do not believe the one whom he has sent. <sup>39</sup> You search the Scriptures because you think that in them you have eternal life; and it is they that bear witness about me, <sup>40</sup> yet you refuse to come to me that you may have life. <sup>41</sup> I do not receive glory from people. 42 But I know that you do not have the love of God within you. 43 I have come in my Father's name, and you do not receive me. If another comes in his own name, you will receive him. 44 How can you believe, when you receive glory from one another and do not seek the glory that comes from the only God? <sup>45</sup> Do not think that I will accuse you to the Father. There is one who accuses you: Moses, on whom you have set your hope. 46 For if you believed Moses, you would believe me; for he wrote of me. 47 But if you do not believe his writings, how will you believe my words?"

### Life Group Discussion Questions

Based on John 5:30-47

For the week of May 29, 2022

#### Reading the Text:

- 1. Jesus is continuing a rebuke of the Jewish religious leaders.

  Describe the context of the rebuke what situation brought it up? How would you paraphrase Jesus' comments in vv. 19 29?

  What do His comments here in vv. 30 47 add to the rebuke?
- 2. Who/What are the witnesses that Jesus lists to support His credibility? What does Jesus say about how each witness connects to the Jewish leaders?
- 3. According to Jesus in vv. 42 47, from whom are the religious leaders seeking 'glory'? By whom do they stand accused before the Father? Why?

#### **Knowing the Full Picture:**

4. Read Matthew 23:1-12. As Jesus pronounces these woes upon the religious leaders, what parallels do you see between this passage and our current passage in John?

#### Living It Out:

- 5. What are the 'witnesses' in your life that you give confidence in the truth of Christ?
- 6. What role has scripture played in helping you see Jesus as true? What has helped you gain confidence in the scriptures' ability to do this?
- 7. What are the ways that we still seek the approval and the glory of people over the glory of God? How do we catch ourselves and reorient our priorites?
