United States founded by folks fleeing from countries where the government controlled and directed religion.





1636 - Roger Williams, founder of Rhode Island, was the first public official we know of that used "Separation" as a metaphor.

He wrote, there needs to be "a hedge or wall of Separation between the Garden of the Church and the Wilderness of the World." Williams believed that any government involvement in the church would corrupt the church, and governmental pressure to Christianity was not pleasing to God. "Forced worship stinks in God's nostrils."



1789 - Constitution - Amendment # I

"Congress shall make no law respecting an establishment of religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof; or abridging the freedom of speech, or of the press; or the right of the people peaceably to assemble, and to petition the Government for a redress of grievances."



January 1, 1802 - President Thomas Jefferson's letter to the Danbury Baptist Association


"Believing with you that religion is a matter which lies solely between Man & his God, that he owes account to none other for his faith or his worship, that the legitimate powers of government reach actions only, & not opinions, I contemplate with sovereign reverence that act of the whole American people which declared




that their legislature should "make no law respecting an establishment of religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof," thus building a wall of separation between Church & State. Adhering to this expression of the supreme will of the nation in behalf of the rights of conscience, I shall see with sincere satisfaction the progress of those sentiments which tend to restore to man all his natural rights, convinced he has no natural right in opposition to his social duties."









 and every State Constitution.






Apostle Paul – "Let every person be subject to the governing authorities. For there is no authority except from God, and those that exist have been instituted by God. Therefore whoever resists the authorities resists what God has appointed, and those who resist will incur judgement.

For rulers are not a terror to good conduct, but to bad, Would you have no fear of the one who is in authority? Then do what is good, and you will receive his approval, for he is God's servant for your good. But if you do wrong, be afraid, for he does not bear the sword in vain. For he is the servant of God an avenger who carries out God's wrath on the wrongdoer. Therefore one must be subjection, not only to avoid God's wrath but also for the sake of conscience.


