

John Piper in *Desiring God:*

- "There are three levels of how to live with things:
- 1) you can steal to get;
- 2) you can work to get; or
- 3) you can work to get in order to give.

Too may professing Christians live on level two...But the Bible pushes us relentlessly to level three...Enough for us; abundance for others to use on good works that alleviate spiritual and physical misery."





 - Less feeling of freedom to live simply and radically sacrificial (ex: The Rich Young Ruler)


