SCRIPTURE THIS WEEK:

John 3:16-21

¹⁶ "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life.¹⁷ For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him. ¹⁸ Whoever believes in him is not condemned, but whoever does not believe is condemned already, because he has not believed in the name of the only Son of God.¹⁹ And this is the judgment: the light has come into the world, and people loved the darkness rather than the light because their works were evil. ²⁰ For everyone who does wicked things hates the light and does not come to the light, lest his works should be exposed.²¹ But whoever does what is true comes to the light, so that it may be clearly seen that his works have been carried out in God."

Life Group Discussion Questions

Based on John 3:16-21 For the week of April 17, 2022

Reading the Text:

- Without using any of the words from the text itself, restate verse 16 in your own words. Who is doing the action? What is He doing? Who are the recipients of the action?
- 2. What does it mean, in v. 18, that those who do not believe are condemned already?
- 3. What does John mean that 'everyone who does wicked things hates the light...and whoever does what is true comes to the light' in vv. 20 - 21?

Knowing the Full Picture:

4. Read a summary of the gospel from the Apostle Paul in Titus3:4-8. Note any similarities and differences between John (in3:16-21) and Paul's statements. Who initiates? Who receives?How do they receive? What are the results of the gospel?

Living It Out:

- 5. We have heard John 3:16 read or quoted so often. Does it still have any emotional impact on us when we read it or hear it?
- 6. In our culture it is very unpopular to talk about the truth of the light and the darkness, of good works and of wickedness. How and when are those appropriate topics for us? Is it a different conversation with believers vs. unbelievers? How so?
- 7. What are some ways that we can more accurately assess darkness that might still be in our hearts, and pursue more of the light of Jesus? How can our Life Group support and encourage each of us in this pursuit?
