Ephesians 3:1-6

¹ For this reason I, Paul, a prisoner of Christ Jesus on behalf of you Gentiles— ² assuming that you have heard of the stewardship of God's grace that was given to me for you, ³ how the mystery was made known to me by revelation, as I have written briefly. ⁴ When you read this, you can perceive my insight into the mystery of Christ, ⁵ which was not made known to the sons of men in other generations as it has now been revealed to his holy apostles and prophets by the Spirit. ⁶ This mystery is that the Gentiles are fellow heirs, members of the same body, and partakers of the promise in Christ Jesus through the gospel.

Paul wants us to be collectively moved by God's plan for the blending of the church and the radical unity the gospel produces.

Paul got the mystery, and it radically changed his life and the Church.

We get the mystery, and it produces radical unity.

Life Group Discussion Questions

Ephesians 3:1-6

For the week of November 19, 2023

Reading the Text:

- 1. What was the big idea of Ephesians 2:19-22 from last week?
- 2. What is the mystery Paul is referring to? In what way is he using the term "mystery"? How is it a mystery in the way your group previously defined?
- 3. Verses 3-4 contain two of Paul's uses of the word "mystery". How did Paul share his insights of the mystery with the Ephesians? What did they "do" to understand the mystery? (Consider vv. 3b & 4a)
- 4. What does it mean that the Gentiles are now "fellow heirs", "members of the same body", and "partakers of the promise in Christ Jesus..."? What is Paul communicating by his use of each of these phrases?
- 5. How would you restate the big idea of the Ephesians 3:1-6 in your own words?

Living It Out:

- 1. At RCC, we use the term "First Hander" to describe someone who seeks to hear from God directly through His Word. Do you think Paul supports this idea? Why or why not? In what ways could it more productive to be a "First Hander" than to rely on hearing from God "Second Hand", "Third Hand", or even further?
- 2. Has there been a time in your life when reading Scripture changed the way you think about a specific attribute of the character of God? What was the truth, and what was that experience like?
- 3. When you think of the term "radical unity", what ideas come to mind? What does this kind of unity look like? How can we as a Life Group encourage each other to pursue this kind of unity in the faith?
