⁴When you read this, you can perceive my insight into the <u>mystery</u> <u>of Christ</u>, ⁵ which was not made known to the sons of men in other generations as it has now been revealed to his holy apostles and prophets by the Spirit. ⁶<u>This mystery is that the Gentiles are</u> <u>fellow heirs</u>, <u>members of the same body</u>, and <u>partakers of the</u> <u>promise in Christ Jesus through the gospel</u>.

⁷ Know then that it is <u>those of faith who are the sons of Abraham</u>.
